1 Samuel 25:1-35: "Abigail prevents war"

The next step is to attend one (or if you wish, both) of the congregational meetings. The first took place last week, Sunday, the 29th. The second will take place today Sunday, May 6. The meeting will begin at 12 noon and last one hour. While we value having filled out the surveys, it is not a requirement that you must have completed a survey in order to be involved in the rest of the process. The purpose of the congregational meetings is to hear and learn from each other and put into practice what we have completed with our recent decision concerning consensus building.

We will then test for consensus with a sample ballot at the end of each meeting. If someone has attended both meetings, they are to complete only one ballot, unless they have changed their mind. Then they will need to state what has changed so we have an accurate count.

People will also need to sign the covenant (or have signed it last year) to be able then to give their final discernment in June. There will be three Sundays available for signing, May 20, 27 and June 6.
